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## What is fascism?

Fascism has been given several related, but different, [definitions](#) since the far-right political philosophy was established by Benito Mussolini (on the left of Adolf Hitler in the photo above). Fascism has been difficult to define for a few reasons:

- It's a relatively new concept
  - Monarchies have been around since Ancient Egypt and the first democracy came from Ancient Athens, but fascism began a little more than 100 years ago, around the same time the Band-Aid® was invented.
- No central theory
  - Fascism is a reactionary ideology that encourages a movement back to a previous, more conservative time (e.g. Make America Great Again). Given this characteristic, it can morph based on the country or the progressive policies it is trying to replace. For example, fascism took different forms in Mussolini's Italy and Hitler's Germany. We are seeing it play out in yet another way in Trump's America.
- Propaganda
  - In 1946, George Orwell [wrote](#) that "*Fascism* has now no meaning except in so far as it signifies 'something not desirable'" as it was being "abused" and "used in a consciously dishonest way." We've seen the right do the same with the words "woke" and "critical race theory." A definition of fascism is hard to nail down because the word is being [misused](#) to purposefully cause confusion and detract from the fascists themselves.

Given the ambiguous nature of the term, Fascism Fighters will use a comprehensive [list of characteristics](#) that many fascist regimes have in common to ultimately define the word and reveal the true, fascist nature of Donald Trump.

## Liar, liar, country on fire

When it comes to presidents telling lies, Donald Trump is not the first, but [he is the worst](#). Why do we allow the President of the United States to lie to us? Not just this fascist Donald Trump, but any president? The people need to take back the power and [hold our leaders accountable](#). Let's fact check this fascist:

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**Trump:** “The [fact](#) that 300 million people died last year from drugs. That’s what’s illegal.”

**Fact:** There are [340 million](#) Americans. Last year, [62 million](#) people died *across the entire world*. This is the same week when he said “[smart people don’t like me](#).” But let’s just continue to ignore his obvious [mental decline](#).

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**Trump:** “You signed another document for a property in [Georgia](#) stating that it would be your primary residence for the next year...(this) calls into question your competence and trustworthiness as a financial regulator.”

**Fact:** “Federal Reserve governor Lisa Cook declared in financial forms that her [Atlanta](#) property would be used as a “vacation home” and not her primary residence.” Nothing in Cook’s [background](#) suggests we can’t trust her competence and trustworthiness, but there’s plenty in Trump’s [background](#) that proves he doesn’t have either.

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**Trump:** “[Radical left](#) political violence has hurt too many innocent people and taken too many lives.”

**Fact:** The last 31 political attacks have been made by the [right wing](#). It’s no wonder why the DOJ [removed](#) a [2024 study](#) from their website that proved “the number of far-right attacks continues to outpace all other types of terrorism and domestic violent extremism. Since 1990, far-right extremists have committed far more ideologically motivated homicides than far-left or radical Islamist extremists, including 227 events that took more than 520 lives. In this same period, far-left extremists committed 42 ideologically motivated attacks that took 78 lives.”

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**Trump:** [Just watch for yourself](#)

**Fact:** This is bonkers. Either the President is directly lying to the American people on purpose or he can’t tell the letters are fake. And [75% of Republicans](#) approve of his job performance (as of 4/23/25). This is BONKERS.

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**Trump:** “Hard to believe, they have some states passing legislation where you can execute the baby after birth. It’s crazy.”

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**Fact:** Murder is [still illegal](#) in all 50 states, but it doesn't matter, because [his supporters like when he lies](#). Besides, we don't kill babies right after birth in America. We wait until they're [in school](#).

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**Trump:** "Over the past four years, 21 million people poured into the United States."

**Fact,** per the [Kiel Institute Ukraine Support Tracker](#): Between January 22nd, 2024 and February 28, 2025, Europe as a whole spent \$157.9 billion on the war Russia started in Ukraine, while the US spent \$136.2 billion. Europe has committed an additional \$110.6 billion.

## [Characteristics of fascism](#)

Since fascism is [difficult to define](#), assigning characteristics to the ideology has been an effective strategy used by experts throughout history. The following is a comprehensive list derived from multiple sources and will serve as the basis for proving beyond any doubt that Donald Trump is a fascist:

## [Use of enemy as a scapegoat and distraction](#)

Hitler blamed Jews and communists. Mussolini blamed foreigners and Bolshevism. Donald Trump blames immigrants, transgender people, scientists and authors who don't say what he



wants them to, judges who don't make decisions he favors, and anyone and anything DEI related, to name a few. They're easy scapegoats to avoid talking about actual policies that help Americans and it's typical for a fascist.

## [Anti-minority / chauvinistic](#)

Throughout history, fascists have treated minorities as second-class citizens, limiting their rights and influence on the culture of a country. As a democracy, through the Civil Rights Movement and Women's Suffrage (among other campaigns), America has been trying to right its many wrongs, but Donald Trump's fascist regime is trying to undo all of that good and return our country to its oppressive roots.

## [Call for a national rebirth](#)

When Donald Trump says he wants to "Make America Great Again," he's echoing a long history of fascists who have said much of the same. Mussolini sought a revival of the Roman Empire and Hitler wanted to bring back the German Reich through the Third Reich. When was America at its greatest? More specifically, who was it great for?

## [Extreme nationalism](#)

It's acceptable to love your own country. That's being a patriot. It's not acceptable to believe your country is inherently better than all others and to blame everyone else for the problems you created for yourself. It's completely unacceptable to treat your long-time allies as adversaries.

## [Use of violence](#)

Fascists can't use the truth or logic, so they use lies and violence to get what they want. Human lives are an inconvenience to a fascist and they will take as many as they want. Fascists throughout history have murdered several millions of people and Donald Trump is no different. In fact, [he sounds ready](#), "I could stand in the middle of Fifth Avenue and shoot somebody, and I wouldn't lose any voters, OK? It's, like, incredible."

## [Aggressive militarism](#)

Most people would agree that having a strong military is essential to national defense and security. However, fascists [use the military](#) for their imperialistic goals and their internal war



against dissenters and perceived enemies, including its own citizens. We sleep better at night with the feeling of safety of the military, but if a fascist like Donald Trump is in charge, [stay woke](#).

## [Cult of personality](#)

In order to make fascism work, the leader needs to have a large following of people who won't admit anything wrong about them. The leader needs to be perceived as strong and infallible, taking on a near mythical status. Mussolini and Donald Trump both claimed to be saved by God after their assassination attempts.

## [Anti-intellectualism and cultural repression](#)

Academia and the arts are threats to fascist regimes because they encourage critical thinking and celebrate diverse perspectives. This goes against the unwavering loyalty and complete control fascists need to implement their authoritarianism. They light "witches" (women) with the flames of burning books.

## [Advancement of propaganda through a controlled mass media](#)

"Truth never damages a cause that is just." - Mahatma Gandhi. And because fascism is the antithesis of justice, it must hide and distort the truth. Anyone who says the independent media is "[truly the enemy of the people](#)," as Donald Trump did, is the real enemy of the people.

## [Authoritarian tendencies and aspirations](#)

Donald Trump has said that he wants to be a dictator. That word should never leave the mouth of a true American patriot and *especially* not the President of the United States unless it is a strict and complete condemnation. Now he's acting like one. "When someone shows you who they are, believe them the first time" - Maya Angelou.

## [Imperialistic ambitions](#)

A fascist's obsession for power and control doesn't stop at their country's borders. Like Hitler and Mussolini before him, Donald Trump is continuing a long succession of fascists who have a need to grow their territory by targeting smaller and weaker nations. It's a continuation of the



capitalist drive that requires companies to grow and expand in perpetuity at the expense of the workers and the environment through deregulation.

## **Mass mobilization**

In a digital world, mass mobilization can be done in the traditional form of parades and mass gatherings, but it can also be a popular social media account or podcast. No matter the avenue, these gatherings and popular voices are used to appeal to emotion rather than reason. Donald Trump (and his famous supporters) uses social media and lies to amplify his message.

## **Elimination of human rights to prioritize the state**

Fascists like Donald Trump (and Hilter and Mussolini before him) eliminate human rights because, to them, nothing should be prioritized over the desires of the nation. Trump is openly assaulting free speech and deporting US citizens to foreign prisons without due process. ["First they came for..."](#)

## **Religion and government are intertwined**

Fascists use religion to reach and control a large number of people who are already strong believers in something and connect it to the fascist ideology while religions use the fascist government to protect themselves, much like the arrangement between the Catholic Church and the Nazis. We will fight to keep the Establishment Clause and the freedom it grants citizens of all faiths and no faith.

## **Promotion of corporate power / Suppression of labor power**

"Fascism should more properly be called corporatism because it is the merger of state and corporate power." – Benito Mussolini. The wealth and influence of the corporate elite is another tool of control for fascists. Worker rights, like human rights, are seen as a loss of control and are therefore repressed. Trump's tax cuts and the aftermath is a prime example.

## **Obsession with law and order**

To be clear, fascists only obsess about law and order when it serves them. Ripe with double standards and hypocrisy, fascists like Donald Trump apply the law how they see fit, regardless

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of the precedents or rules in place. Societies need law and order to promote justice and fairness, but taking it too far can lead to an erosion of personal liberties and an attack on the populace.

## **Youth indoctrination**

For the ideology to live on, fascists must corrupt the next generation and those to come, with much of the indoctrination happening in school. Children will only learn what serves the fascist government as they prepare them to inherit the authoritarian ideology. Donald Trump wants American children to learn his version of science and history, not actual science and history.

## **Cronyism and corruption**

Competency takes a backseat to loyalty in a fascist regime. The leader must have strict authority and does not tolerate dissent. Hitler chose a man with no military or weapons experience to lead his war effort strictly because of his undying loyalty. Trump has chosen his allies for the same reason.

## **Demand of unwavering loyalty**

A fascist leader demands blind obedience, especially from their administration. Donald Trump can never be wrong or even be challenged. He rules through fear and control. Every word and action is a test of allegiance. Independent thought and logic are eliminated along with all other opposition.

## **Fraudulent elections**

Fascists will do whatever is necessary to stay in power. They hate democracy and don't respect the tenet of fair elections. Fascists have no intention of relinquishing their power, so they give the appearance of the people having the freedom to exercise their vote. The assault on The Capitol on January 6th (and the subsequent pardoning of all the criminals involved) showed how much Donald Trump detests our democratic processes.

## **Desire for economic self-sufficiency**

Fascists want to exert as much control as they can over their country, so they actively try to isolate themselves from the rest of the world. For Donald Trump and his "America First" policy, it

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means undoing decades of goodwill with our allies and other global strategic, economic, and security interests.

## **“Work makes you free”**

These were the words above the gates at Auschwitz, the largest Nazi concentration camp. Hard labor with little to no rights serves the fascist regime as a form of discipline and control of the people. Fascists like Donald Trump want free labor, not free citizens.

## [Trump Administration deports legal U.S. resident because of an "administrative error" - 4/10/2025](#)

ICE, the Immigration and Customs Enforcement agency, [deported](#) an innocent, legal U.S. resident and father over a mistake, despite him having court ordered protection against that. Kilmar Armando Ábrego García has never had a criminal record and was afforded no due process, despite being protected by the [U.S. Constitution and Supreme Court precedent](#).

If this doesn't scare or enrage you (or both), then you're as much of a fascist as Donald Trump. That wannabe dictator is acting like one, ignoring well established laws and court rulings with absolutely no authority to do so. We would be wise to remember that Hitler employed [deportations](#) as well...

## [The U.S. Government can\(not\) deport you for what you believe - 4/10/2025](#)

## [The irony of work requirements for Medicaid - 4/10/25](#)

In addition to cutting funding, Republicans are trying to impose work requirements on Medicaid, which is yet another policy taken directly from [Project 2025](#). Due to the complexity and confusion this causes, it will result in people losing healthcare coverage, [as we've already seen](#).

Per [ProPublica](#), “[Department of Energy report](#) estimated that the efficiency standards are now saving the average American household about \$576 a year on their utility bills, while cutting the nation's energy consumption by 6.5% and water consumption by 12%. A 2022 survey by the Consumer Federation of America found that [76% of Americans](#) support the government setting efficiency standards for appliances.”

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Donald Trump agrees with the 2.5-gallons-per-minute standard for showers, but under previous regulation, if a shower had multiple showerheads, they all had to collectively meet the same 2.5-gallons-per-minute standard. Who has showers with multiple showerheads? Wealthy people. Instead of addressing the [rise of children in poverty](#) or the [increasing homeless population](#), he prioritizes his [“beautiful hair”](#) and [rich friends](#).

## [There are 3 branches of the U.S. Government. Donald Trump wants 1 - 4/11/25](#)

Donald Trump and his spineless lackeys want an authoritarian grip around the neck of democracy. They [passed a bill](#) in the House “that limits the authority of federal district judges to issue nationwide orders.” This authority was given in the Constitution in 1787 and has kept checks and balances on all three branches of government since.

“However, science policy experts have been more alarmed, characterizing such cuts as an “extinction level” event for what is seen as the crown jewel of the space agency. Nearly all of NASA's most significant achievements over the last 25 years have been delivered by the science programs, including feats such as *Ingenuity* flying on Mars, New Horizons swooping by Pluto, and Cassini's discovery of water plumes on Enceladus.”

As troubling as it is, [it's not surprising](#). Scientists, like the [judges](#), [press](#), and [intellectuals](#) he is currently attacking, challenge his fascist agenda of spewing propaganda and [lies](#). This is also yet another example of Trump using the [Project 2025](#) playbook. Carl Sagan's quote from his book *The Demon Haunted World: Science as a Candle in the Dark* foretold what would happen if our society de-prioritized and further exploration:

“Science is more than a body of knowledge; it is a way of thinking. I have a foreboding of America in my children's or grandchildren's time – when the United States is a service and information economy; when nearly all the key manufacturing industries have slipped away to other countries; when awesome technological powers are in the hands of a very few; and no

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one representing the public interest can even grasp the issues; when the people have lost the ability to set their own agendas or knowledgeably question those in authority; when, clutching our crystals and nervously consulting our horoscopes, our critical faculties in decline, unable to distinguish between what's good and what's true, we slide, almost without noticing, back into superstition and darkness."

## [Swasticars for sale](#) - 4/14/25

Donald Trump used the White House lawn to [film a car commercial](#) for Tesla in what might be the first time *ever* a President of the United States of America has officially endorsed a product. He was even [provided a sales pitch](#). Howard Lutnick, the Secretary of Commerce, also gave a recommendation to "[buy Tesla](#)" because one corrupt government endorsement wasn't enough. And [it worked](#).

The reason this is unprecedented and corrupt is because [everything about it is illegal](#). And there's good reason for that. According to [Barron's](#), "Lutnick may have stood to gain personally from his appearance, as well: the financial firm he founded, Cantor Fitzgerald, had nearly \$300 million in Tesla shares on its books as of the end of last year, according to recent filing." If they have the power to sway financial markets, they have the opportunity to sway them in ways they can benefit from. While some lawmakers are [trying to fight](#), others are [cashing in](#). They're representing the 1% and [repressing the rest of us](#).

## [Don't ever, ever, ever fuck with Harriet Tubman](#) - 4/14/25

The fascist cowards in the Trump Administration [purged government websites](#) of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) images and stories in an attempt to [rewhite](#)/rewrite American history and erase the achievements and contributions of women and minorities. Some have been restored, others haven't, none should have been gone in the first place.

The [AP provided](#) this [side-by-side comparison](#) of before and after the purge on the National Parks Service's website. Among other changes, the word or variation of the word "slave" was used almost half as much after the purge and went from the 7th word used in the article to the 112th. Clearly, Donald Trump is [continuing to downplay slavery](#) and the consequences that are still being felt today.

While every single person and event depicted in those images was just as important and worthy, DON'T FUCK WITH HARRIET TUBMAN. She will always be one of the greatest American heroes and her legacy will not be tarnished by a fascist [rapist](#).

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Her words are just as meaningful now as they were back then, "If I could have convinced more slaves that they were slaves, I could have freed thousands more." ## [Trump is deporting people for alleged gang tattoos. Well, not the white ones](#) - 4/14/25

Donald Trump is [arresting people](#) who are in the country legally and do not have criminal records by the hundreds, even after being [court ordered to stop](#), and is deporting them using the "the Alien Enemies Act of 1798, which has been used only three times in U.S. history. The law requires a president to declare the U.S. is at war," according to [NPR](#).

They are identifying these legal residents with their [tattoos](#), which is ironic, because Pete Hegseth has some potentially dangerous ones of his own. He was even identified by a fellow service member as an "[insider threat](#)" because one of them is a [rallying cry for white supremacists](#).

However, unlike those who were deported without due process, we can't take the tattoos at face value and make rash judgements. They might simply be Christian symbols that reference the [Crusades](#). Besides, Hegseth [technically wasn't charged](#) with a crime either. Let's look at some quotes from his aptly titled book "[American Crusade](#)" and see if there are any concerning parallels (per [Wikipedia](#)):

"irreconcilable differences between the Left and the Right in America leading to perpetual conflict that cannot be resolved through the political process"

"hour *is* late for America. Beyond political success, her fate relies on exorcising the leftist specter dominating education, religion, and culture – a 360-degree holy war for the righteous cause of human freedom"

"Our American Crusade is not about literal swords, and our fight is not with guns. Yet."

"Yes, there will be some form of civil war"

"mock, humiliate, intimidate, and crush our leftist opponents"

"We don't want to fight, but, like our fellow Christians a thousand years ago, we must. We need an American crusade."

This fascist is in charge of the Department of Defense, making him more dangerous than basically anyone else who has ever had a tattoo. But he won't get [deported](#).

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## [SAVE us the bullshit. The SAVE Act is voter suppression - 4/16/25](#)

The [SAVE Act](#) is being touted as a way to prevent noncitizens from voting. Donald Trump, without any evidence whatsoever, [repeatedly blamed illegal voting](#) for losing the popular vote in 2016. The Brennan Center for Justice [performed an analysis](#) and confirmed what we already knew: "In the jurisdictions we studied, very few noncitizens voted in the 2016 election. Across 42 jurisdictions, election officials who oversaw the tabulation of 23.5 million votes in the 2016 general election referred only an estimated 30 incidents of suspected noncitizen voting for further investigation or prosecution. In other words, improper noncitizen votes accounted for 0.0001 percent of the 2016 votes in those jurisdictions."

Noncitizens voting is [already illegal](#) under penalty of perjury, so what does the SAVE Act hope to accomplish? The Center for American Progress [provides us with a few facts](#):

- The [Safeguard American Voter Eligibility \(SAVE\) Act](#) would require all American citizens registering to vote or updating their registration information to present **documentary proof of citizenship in person**. For the vast majority of Americans, this would be a **passport or birth certificate**.
  - Approximately **146 million American citizens do not possess a valid passport**—for context, [153 million Americans voted](#) in the 2024 presidential general election
  - [84 percent of women who marry change their surname](#), meaning as many as **69 million American women** do not have a birth certificate with their legal name on it and thereby could not use their birth certificate to prove citizenship.
  - **Only 1 in 4** Americans with a [high school degree or less](#) have a valid passport.
  - **Only 1 in 5** Americans with [income below \\$50,000](#) have a valid passport.

The [SAVE Act](#) also says that it "specifies what documents are considered acceptable proof of U.S. citizenship, such as identification that complies with the REAL ID Act of 2005 that indicates U.S. citizenship." However, the Center for American Progress [also points out](#) "Government-issued driver's licenses—including REAL IDs—as well as military or tribal IDs do not satisfy the bill's requirements."

To sum up, this fascist wants to keep women, trans people, and poor people from [voting](#). Are we going to let him?

## [Iron Dome? Golden Dome? A domeass idea that's more Spaceballs than Star Wars - 4/20/25](#)

Donald Trump submitted yet another executive order straight from the authoritarianism-soaked pages of [Project 2025](#): "[The Iron Dome for America](#)." It's a space-based missile defense system

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intended to protect against foreign ballistic, hypersonic, advanced cruise missiles, and nuclear aerial attacks. If this sounds familiar, it's because Ronald Reagan proposed the same solution in his "[Star Wars](#)" initiative.

The reason for ridicule is because like many decisions from a fascist organization, it didn't come from experts or [scientists](#). Here's what actual smart people are saying about this idea:

[Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists](#): "It is already arguable whether all ICBMs, SLBMs, bombers, and upscaled battle management, command, control and communications required for the next-generation strategic offensive weapons...are affordable or even necessary."

[Breaking Defense](#): "This [Iron Dome] doesn't solve the problem of vulnerability...It simply gives America's adversaries incentives to adapt their own forces to ensure that they're able to assure their ability to retaliate."

[Union of Concerned Scientists](#): "President Trump's vision of an Iron Dome over America is a fantasy...Trump's idea of a space-based missile defense is a bad investment...Russia and China already appear to be building new types of weapons with the purpose of defeating or avoiding missile defenses. Missile defenses are not a useful or long-term strategy for keeping the US safe from nuclear weapons."

[Responsible Statecraft](#): "The only reliable defense against nuclear-armed missiles is to reduce the chances that they will be launched in the first place, which calls for a revival of arms control talks between the U.S. and Russia, and a dialogue on future nuclear developments with China"

[Aerospace America](#): "The idea of an impenetrable missile shield over the United States is not achievable...It's ruinously expensive and strategically unwise, because what you'll do is your adversary will just build more and it will always be much less expensive for them to spend a little bit more to make you spend a lot."

And although there are already [defense contractors lining up](#) to make this regular fantasy a really expensive fantasy, it should come as no surprise that Elon Musk, [a Nazi](#), is [the frontrunner](#) for the contract. It should also come as no surprise that he wants to charge America [subscription pricing](#) for it. Because fascists are also corrupt. And Donald Trump is a fascist.

[Trump chooses a fraud to lead the IRS because of course he did](#) -

Donald Trump chose Billy Long, seen above holding fake money and missing a neck, to lead the IRS due to his extensive experience as a tax attorney and CPA. Just kidding, but he can [talk gibberish really fast](#) and has a [fake certification](#), so he's more qualified than most of Trump's nominations.

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He also has troubling connections. An [investigation is being called](#) to look into his history of promoting non-existent tax breaks and profiting from the [fraudulent scheme](#). In a completely expected and unsurprising move, Donald Trump has violated the [Establishment Clause](#) of the U.S. Constitution with his executive order "[Eradicating Anti-Christian Bias](#)." The [christian nationalism](#) that has been bubbling up in the Republican Party is starting to boil over.

The order cites attacks on Christian buildings and violence against its practitioners while ignoring context and data:

[A-Mark Foundation](#): "Only 18% of attacks targeting Christian or Catholic places of worship were motivated by racial, ethnic, or religious hatred. However, attacks targeting Jewish (93%) and Muslim (83%) houses of worship were overwhelmingly motivated by antisemitic or Islamophobic hate."

[Dolan Consulting Group](#): "The only religions that showed a clearly disproportionate rate of violence incidents were Islamic mosques and Sikh temples. Islamic mosques make up less than 1% of the places of worship in the U.S., yet 2% of all violence incidents occurred at mosques. Sikh temples make up less than 0.1% of the places of worship in the U.S., yet 1% of all violent offenses occurred at these temples."

While setting the stage for a modern [Inquisition](#), Trump is claiming victimhood and persecution against a [privileged](#) majority, [much like Hitler did](#). It's time for Christians, [the majority of Americans](#), to find some time (maybe on Christmas, because no other religion has a federally recognized holiday), open their Trump "God Bless the USA" Bible ([that was made in China](#)), consider what they truly [believe](#), and read [Matthew 7:15](#) - "Watch out for false prophets. ## [Trump honors fascist tradition of accusing others what he's guilty of, Part 1 - 4/28/25](#)

Donald Trump is directing the Attorney General to [open an investigation](#) into ActBlue, the largest Democrat fundraising platform, for accusations of unlawful activities. In other words, another fascist leader is weaponizing the federal government to target political opponents after accusing the previous administration of weaponizing the federal government to target political opponents. With fascists, [accusations are often confessions](#).

Trump is doing this because he's scared, and he should be. The site has collected [over \\$400 million](#) in the first three months of 2025, a reflection of [Trump's plummeting approval ratings](#) as seen by the massive anti-Trump protests occurring [nationwide](#) and [across the globe](#). And Republicans are already [understandably nervous](#) about the 2026 midterms, so taking away Democrat funding is the next step on the authoritarian checklist.

Notably, Republicans investigated ActBlue last year over similar empty allegations and [found nothing](#) - "Documents turned over revealed that as of September 2024, ActBlue has implemented updated policies to "automatically reject donations that use foreign prepaid/gift cards, domestic gift cards, are from high-risk/sanctioned countries, and have the highest level of risk as determined." So what is this about?

Now that we've covered the accusation, let's explore the confession in [Part 2](#).

## [Trump honors fascist tradition of accusing others what he's guilty of, Part 2 - 4/28/25](#)

In [Part 1](#), we demonstrated how Donald Trump is weaponizing the federal government against ActBlue despite a complete absence of evidence. Predictably, the investigation excludes WinRed, the ActBlue counterpart which [Trump himself helped create](#). Fascists love [law and order](#), because when they control it, they can break the law in any order they choose.

And that's likely what WinRed is doing. It's bad enough they [deceive their own donors](#) with an automatic opt-in for recurring donations resulting in millions of dollars in unintended contributions, but it somehow gets worse. To run a business, a company needs to spend money on office space, wages for employees, insurance, marketing, and other expenses known as [operating expenditures](#), or OpEx. According to a complaint the Campaign Legal Center [submitted to the FEC](#), ActBlue processed over \$5.5 billion in contributions and reported over \$85 million in operating expenditures. During the same time period, WinRed collected over \$2.8 billion in contributions and reported *less than \$2,700* in operating expenditures. Yes, you read that right. No, WinRed is not being investigated.

Speaking of the FEC, Donald Trump has recently tried to (illegally) [fire a Democrat member](#) and issued an executive order (illegally) [granting him power](#) over that and all other independent agencies, continuing the [implementation of Project 2025](#). He wants authority over the agencies designed to hold him accountable, which is why they're independent and established by Congress and protected by the Constitution in the first place. Presidents of democracies don't seek to control every facet of government by attacking the checks and balances that uphold the law, but fascists like Donald Trump do.

## [Trump's new executive order puts the "law" in martial law](#) - 4/29/25

Donald Trump's new [executive order](#) is terrifying. He's not even trying to hide his intention to [weaponize](#) the military against U.S. citizens. The language of the order is a dog whistle with a megaphone. Trump wants to "**unleash** high-impact local police forces" of "**tenacious** law enforcement officers" so that they can "effectively be utilized to **prevent crime**." This violent rhetoric empowers violent actions. And unless Trump thinks we're in [Minority Report](#), he can't prevent crime...without invoking the [Insurrection Act](#).

Trump has entertained the idea of turning the military on U.S. citizens before:

- to [seize voting machines](#) and overturn the 2020 election
- to "[dominate the streets](#)" in response to the George Floyd protests
- during his [2024 presidential campaign](#) when he said he would attack "[the enemy from within](#)" (also a [Hitler quote](#))
- he is [currently waiting to hear](#) from his cabinet if he can invoke the Insurrection Act at the southern border.

There is more worrying language. The order states it will prosecute people who "willfully and unlawfully direct the obstruction of criminal law, including by directly and unlawfully prohibiting law enforcement officers from carrying out duties necessary for public safety and law

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enforcement," conveniently right after [charging a federal judge](#) with the exact same thing. It's purposefully vague for broad application.

What else does the order advocate for?

- "expand access and improve the quality of training available to State and local law enforcement" (i.e. remember to turn off the body cam)
- "increase pay and benefits for law enforcement officers" (i.e. bribes)
- "strengthen and expand legal protections for law enforcement officers" (i.e. you won't get in trouble for doing awful things to people)
- "seek enhanced sentences for crimes against law enforcement officers" (i.e. excuses to add more charges)
- "promote investment in the security and capacity of prisons" (i.e. [deportation camps](#))
- "prioritize prosecution of any applicable violations of Federal criminal law with respect to State and local jurisdictions" for local "officials" (i.e. do what we say or else)

Don't give the Trump Administration credit for any of these though. They are pretty much all [directly adopted from the Nazis](#).









This is what they want to believe, because [they have a need to](#) follow a strong leader. But these photos are as fake as the notion that Trump is strong or a leader.

Cults are dangerous because [dogma is dangerous](#). Donald Trump is [defying orders from the Supreme Court](#) and has [broken federal law and the Constitution](#) several times, leading to

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[hundreds of lawsuits](#) against the Trump Administration, but his [propaganda machine](#) ignores and deflects.

If the AP knowingly reported lies as facts, it's expected that a large portion of their readers would lose trust in them, because that's exactly why they read the AP. [Fox News did this](#) and their readers continued to support them, because they aren't interested in the truth [if they don't agree with it](#). When it was time for Biden to go, [Democrats said so](#). That time will probably never happen with Trump and his cult.

Fascist leaders have [relied on their personality cults](#) to gain popularity and consolidate power before wielding both [against their own nations](#). With Donald Trump recently [not committing to upholding due process](#) for U.S. citizens, we're watching it unfold.

## [Who has two thumbs and wants the American people to spend tens of millions of dollars on his birthday party?](#) [Donald Trump - 5/7/25](#)

Donald Trump is going to throw a birthday party for the Army on June 14th, the same day as his birthday. The [AP reports](#) that it will include a 4 mile long parade that will involve "more than 6,600 soldiers, at least 150 vehicles, 50 helicopters, seven bands and possibly a couple thousand civilians...seven Army bands and a parachute jump by the Golden Knights." Parades are [typical authoritarian events](#) since authoritarians are [typical vulnerable narcissists](#).

This isn't the first time Trump has attempted to throw a parade for ~~the Army~~ himself. He had one canceled during his first term over the high price tag, but [Trump himself](#) assured the costs for the new one would be "peanuts compared to the value." The [initial parade](#) had "estimated costs to the military of \$92 million and public safety costs to the District of Columbia of more than \$21 million." That sounds like a lot, until you consider the proposed safety costs were less than the [America taxpayers have spent](#) on Trump golfing this year. See? Peanuts.

This is all characteristically out of touch. The overwhelming majority of U.S. citizens are [anxious about their financial situation](#). According to a [recent Gallup poll](#), most Americans are worried about several economic issues right now. Notably, a lack of self-serving, fascist dictator parties isn't on the list of concerns.

The ultimate irony is that Trump was inspired after [witnessing the French Bastille Day](#) parade. Donald Trump is [accepting a \\$400 million dollar plane](#) from the government of Qatar as a gift. As with many of [his executive orders](#), this violates the U.S. Constitution. It specifically goes against the [Emoluments Clause](#), a law that forbids government officials from accepting presents from foreign governments, something Trump did [during his first term](#). Attorney General Pam Bondi approved the gift. This is the same Pam Bondi that [failed to reveal](#) that she was a [lobbyist for the Qatari government](#) while being considered for her current position. This is the same Pam Bondi that, as the Florida Attorney General, [declined to take legal action](#) against Trump University after she accepted an illegal donation from the Trump Foundation. This is the same Pam Bondi that is supposed to work as the Attorney General for the United States and its citizens, not its fascist President.

The conflicts of interest are already obvious. The Trump Organization [refused to pledge](#) to avoid making deals with foreign companies and announced in April that the Trump family is building a [new luxury golf resort in...Qatar](#). At least the U.S. has a system of checks and balances to keep corruption in check. The inspectors general and the head of the Office of Government Ethics can investigate - oh wait - [Trump illegally fired them](#).

### **[Assault for me but not for thee](#) - 5/21/25**







### The evidence is clear

**Donald Trump continues decades of overt racism**



### **Contradictions abound**







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The [physical standards of ICE agents](#) are so pathetic for an adult that a 6 year old girl is expected to have the same muscular strength as an adult professional [kidnapper](#). But it gets worse, because this is for the more specialized HSI agents. For the ERO agents, the ones primarily hiding behind masks and snatching [US citizens](#) off the street, the standards are even lower.

Then there is the push up with-a-4-inch-foam-block test. ## Trump





### **Jamie Dimon loves child sex trafficking money**

To get up to speed, here are some facts about Jeffrey Epstein's relationship with J.P. Morgan:

- Jeffrey Epstein was a J.P. Morgan client for 15 years, with [Jamie Dimon](#) serving as CEO for the last seven of those years and Epstein being a convicted sex offender (after pleading guilty to soliciting a minor for prostitution in a [sweetheart deal](#)) for the last five of those years.
- Epstein kept [hundreds of millions of dollars](#) in over 134 accounts from which the bank processed more than \$1 billion in transactions for him (much of that going or coming from overseas).
- The bank paid him tens of millions of dollars because he was “the biggest revenue generator among investor clients in the private-banking division.”
- They allowed him to take out millions of dollars in cash without the [legally required](#) step of reporting it to federal regulators, which investigators later showed he used to pay young women and teenagers.
- Executives joked about the number of “[nymphettes](#)” at his house, but appreciated the world leaders and billionaires he introduced to the bank.
- Executives fielded several suspicious activity reports, or SARs, from over [four dozen](#) employees and did nothing, despite being legally required to report them, revealing



[deficiencies](#) in the bank's own processes (or in the moral judgement of those executives).

- JPM opened accounts for two young women (at Epstein's request) without actually speaking to either of them.
- JPM gave financial backing of at least [\\$1 million](#) to Epstein in order to help he and [Jean-Luc Brunel](#), a French modeling scout, open a modeling agency called MC2. They used it to lure underage models with promises of modeling work. The company's former bookkeeper admitted it wasn't a successful business or functioning agency and that the "only reason Mr. Epstein was involved was because of the girls, I think, because it was not a profitable business." [Brunel](#) was accused of raping underage girls and committed suicide while waiting for trial, which [sounds](#) a lot like [how](#) Epstein [died](#). What a coincidence.

More facts can be found in [this article](#), an excellent, comprehensive account of J.P. Morgan and how they enabled Epstein. One of the main reasons Epstein was a client for so long is Jes Staley, the No. 2 executive at J.P. Morgan behind Jamie Dimon since 2004. He was Epstein's close friend for years and someone who went to bat for Epstein multiple times when the bank was considering dropping him as a client. But Staley, [another rich pervert](#), seemed to really enjoy what Epstein could do for him, as highlighted by this interaction: "That was fun. Say hi to Snow White," Staley emailed in 2010. Epstein responded by asking which character he would like next. "Beauty and the Beast," Staley answered." It comes as no surprise that Staley later admitted to having sex with one of Epstein's assistants (the year before that conversation), despite being married with two daughters.

And what does Jamie Dimon have to say about this disgusting cheater? "Jes has impeccable character and [integrity](#)." Dimon apparently doesn't have a lot else to say, seeing as he claimed under oath that he "did not recall" discussing Epstein's accounts with anyone at the bank, despite a [profile](#) of him saying "Dimon seemingly meddles in every detail." Staley said under oath that the two talked over the phone and in person regarding Epstein. There were also internal documents regarding Epstein labeled as "pending Dimon review" and "for Jamie." David Boies, one of the attorneys representing Epstein's victims, said that either Dimon knew about Epstein and lied in a sworn deposition or his executives (that reported directly to the known micromanager) didn't tell their boss. "Neither is good," Boies said.

And neither is anywhere close to acceptable for the leader of the bank with the [largest market capitalization](#) in the world. J.P. Morgan clients, do you feel safe with your money being managed by someone who lies under oath or a banker that doesn't know anything about his largest clients or how they make their money? Is a person that purposely breaks federal law trustworthy of your savings and investments? Is that an ideal partner for your business? Maybe if you are a child sex trafficker and rapist. "JPM was his true partner," said Bradley Edwards, another attorney representing Epstein's victims.

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And what price did the bank pay? A total of \$365 million to the [U.S. Virgin Islands](#) and to [Epstein victims](#). A lot of money to most, a rounding error to a bank with \$54 billion in [profits](#) last year, and an insult to the victims. They also didn't admit wrongdoing, no one lost their jobs, and their "[commitments](#)" to fight human trafficking are nothing more than "ongoing good faith efforts" and are "not contractual commitments." Bridgette Carr, a law professor and human-trafficking expert who analyzed J.P. Morgan's role in Epstein's activities, said "I am deeply worried here that the ultimate message to other financial institutions is that they can keep serving traffickers. It's still profitable to do that, given the lack of substantial consequences." How many other child sex traffickers is Jamie Dimon aiding? And why are [Republicans](#) aiding him?

### Raping kids and escaping bids



Senator Ron Wyden's "Follow the Money" investigation is also targeting billionaire [Leon Black](#), who paid Epstein a reported [\\$170 million](#) for tax and estate planning services, despite the dead pedophile having no education, experience, or training in those fields. So why would a billionaire pay such a huge sum of money to a registered sex offender that pled guilty to soliciting a minor for prostitution [four years earlier](#)? Black is also a despicable person. A despicable person that has been accused by [multiple women](#) of rape. A despicable person who was [never audited by the IRS](#) for his financial dealings with Epstein. A despicable person whose son is [being nominated](#) to join the Trump administration, the same administration who is blocking Wyden's investigation and [shielding Black](#) from accountability.

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Is it because [Black](#) and [Trump](#) took a [trip](#) to Russia together and have deep ties to the totalitarian country? Trump's ties are [so deep](#) that "the special counsel who finished the investigation, Robert S. Mueller III, secured three dozen indictments and convictions of some top Trump advisers, and he produced a report that outlined Russia's wide-ranging operations to help get Mr. Trump elected and the president's efforts to impede the inquiry. But law enforcement officials never fully investigated Mr. Trump's own relationship with Russia, even though some career F.B.I. counterintelligence investigators thought his ties posed such a national security threat that they took the extraordinary step of opening an inquiry into them. Within days, the former deputy attorney general Rod J. Rosenstein curtailed the investigation without telling the bureau, all but ensuring it would go nowhere."

So what was Black paying Epstein for? Black paid 0.006% of his net worth in a [settlement](#) to the US Virgin Islands for immunity regarding his role in Epstein's operations, even after Wyden's evidence and Black's own [admittal](#) that his money "partially fund (Epstein's) operations in the Virgin Islands." Leon Black's money paid for the trafficking of children for sex with wealthy men and he's walking around with impunity while his buddy Trump refuses to release the [files](#).

After an investigation by local police, Palm Beach prosecutors wanted to charge Epstein with [aggravated assault](#), "which would have meant no jail time, no requirement that he register as a sex offender and no guaranteed restitution for victims." Fortunately, local investigators approached the U.S. Attorney in Florida to open a federal case to get the victims the justice they deserved. Unfortunately, that U.S. Attorney was Alex Acosta.

It's unfortunate because despite Jeffrey Epstein being investigated for the sexual abuse of over [40 teenage girls](#) and despite that investigation was [still finding more victims](#) and despite federal prosecutors having a [53 page, 60 count indictment](#) prepared and despite that indictment having the potential to put the worst child sex trafficker in history in prison for life, Acosta gave Epstein a "[sweetheart deal](#)." What was so sweet about it? Even though they had plenty of evidence to

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put Epstein away for the rest of his life with federal charges, Acosta oversaw the deal that only included state charges and granted Epstein and his named *and* unnamed co-conspirators immunity from federal charges. Epstein only spent 13 months in jail and was [allowed to leave](#) for 12 hours per day, six days per week to spend time in his [office](#). For sexually abusing and trafficking at least 40 underage girls.

Those victims were completely unaware of the plea deal Acosta made because he violated the [Crime Victims' Rights Act of 2004](#) by not consulting them throughout the process. He only let them know after the deal was already done. He [later admitted](#) that some of the victims wouldn't testify because they were being threatened, which tracks with court records that show Acosta declined to charge Epstein with [two counts of obstruction](#), one of them for trying to convince a victim not to talk to investigators.

As a U.S. Attorney, why would Acosta show favorable treatment to a child rapist who is threatening victims into silence and not to perform the legal bare minimum for those same victims he is supposed to be fighting for? Was it because Epstein's high powered legal team was composed of Acosta's [former coworkers](#) in that same U.S. Attorney's office and another private law firm? Or were they trying to cover something up? Why else would he negotiate a plea *during* an investigation and keep it a [secret](#)?

All that corruption and protecting pedophiles made Acosta an obvious candidate for the first Trump administration. He was brought on as Labor Secretary where he continued to protect pedophiles. In his proposed budget for the Department of Labor in 2020, he planned to cut the funding of the International Labor Affairs Bureau (ILAB) by 80%, from [\\$68 million to \\$18.5 million](#). What is one of the responsibilities of this department? To combat child sex trafficking. In fact, "experts say any major cut to ILAB would be a direct threat to the US government's ability to combat the sexual exploitation of children." But Acosta and Trump already knew that.

[The Miami Herald](#) and the incredible work of [heroine Julie K. Brown](#) led to Acosta [resigning](#) as Labor Secretary, despite Trump feeling "[very badly](#)" for him (but not the actual victims). Acosta currently sits on the [board](#) of [Newsmax](#), a [partner](#) of Donald Trump.



### John Casablancas

The [obituary](#) of John Casablancas said that he had a preference for “child women.” So that’s how we’re starting this one off.

He also ran Elite Model Management in the 80s and 90s, an agency that helped launch the careers of many famous models. An Elite model said that Trump asked her out to dinner. When she told him that she was 17 years old, he responded by saying “That’s just great – you’re not too old, not too young.” A former model also reported that the agency forced them to go out to dinner with Trump and Casablancas. That model was 16 at the time. And it only gets way, way worse from here.

Elite organized the [Look of the Year](#) competition and, in 1991 and 1992, Donald Trump was a [sponsor and judge](#), even offering his hotel to accommodate the contestants. Before the 1992 competition began (where the average age was 15), everyone involved with the competition boarded a chartered cruise and the contestants, as young as 14 years old, danced for Trump (then 45) and some of the other judges. Despite not being part of the official competition, this was mandatory, with one of the contestants recalling “I knew in my gut it wasn’t right. This wasn’t being judged or part of the competition – it was for their entertainment.” After all,

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Casablancas told the models they were being judged on, among other things, their “sense of cooperation.” As creepy as that sounds, it takes on a more predatory meaning when former contestants described many of the young girls as “poor” and “desperate.”

Another part of the entertainment for Trump, Casablancas, and the other older men were the “after hours” parties. “It was very clear that there were opportunities to go out and party with Donald,” a former model said. There were hints “that if you were nice to certain people, good things will happen to you, and I think that’s why girls were going out”. A former reporter who also attended these parties said, “I saw girls sitting on guys’ laps, and I remember one guy putting his hand down a girl’s top. I remember thinking they were younger than me, and I was 17 going on 18.” The contestants were served alcohol at these events, most likely to amplify their “sense of cooperation.”

The Look of the Year competition was [one of the many](#) where Trump would find an excuse to go backstage while the contestants were changing clothes. One [model](#) was told “If you’re over twenty-one you don’t have to worry.” Trump walked into the dressing room during the 1997 Miss Teen USA pageant when girls as young as 15 were naked. When one of them told his daughter Ivanka, her response was “[Yeah, he does that.](#)” How do the models feel? “We were afraid to say anything bad when he was around because we didn’t want anything to hurt our chances of winning...we were all young teenagers.” And how did [Trump](#) feel? “I’m allowed to go in, because I’m the owner of the pageant and therefore I’m inspecting it. You know, they’re standing there with no clothes. ‘Is everybody OK?’ And you see these incredible looking women, and so I sort of get away with things like that.”

Why does all of this matter in a blog post about Trump’s connection to Jeffrey Epstein? Rampant pedophilia aside, in 1990, John Casablancas sent a 15 year old model to a photo shoot where she was photographed naked and then raped by the photographer...Jeffrey Epstein. This was two years after Casablancas sexually assaulted [another 15 year old](#) and then made her get an abortion. A lawsuit for that rape was filed in 2002, and in [2004](#), John Casablancas was on the board of Trump Realty Brazil, working with him yet again.

And after all of this history with John Casablancas that spans decades, multiple business ventures and countries, and drunk, “desperate” teenage girls, Donald Trump claims through his representatives that he “hardly knew him, spent very little time with him, and knew very little about him.” What a coincidence.

- Linda McMahon, who leads Trump's Department of Education and is an [AI expert](#), is being sued by former ring boys who claim they were raped when they were underage by multiple employees at the WWE. [McMahon, they allege, knew about it and ignored the situation](#).
- Lawrence Taylor, who Trump invited to the White House [recently](#), is a registered sex offender after having sex with a 16 year old girl. [Karl Malone](#) must not have been available.

**Cover up**

Speaking of the files, what exactly does the government have that they are hiding from the American people? [Here's what we know:](#)

- 40 computer and electronic devices
- 26 storage drives
- More than 70 CDs and six recording devices
- Approximately 60 pieces of physical evidence, including photos, travel logs and employee logs
- Three discs containing the outcome of court-authorized intercepts of a phone number previously belonging to Ms. Maxwell.
- More than 10,000 downloaded videos and images of illegal child sex material and other pornography

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There's a total of 300 gigabytes of information in the possession of the FBI (which is equivalent to well over 1 million documents). What else is the government hiding? Senator Ron Wyden opened an investigation in [2022](#) into Epstein's financial history and uncovered some troubling information (more on that later). Based on those findings, the Biden Administration allowed investigators to look through reports of suspicious bank activity in order to find evidence of who financed Jeffrey Epstein's child sex trafficking operation. 

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

### How many people have to die?

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

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At a minimum, impeach [Kristi Noem](#) and [Stephen Miller](#). ### [ICE Out](#)
